INTRODUCTION

Giving is an incredible chance to change someone's life. MAST is one such organization that believes in the joy of giving. Founded on 6th September 2002 the trust operates in rural and interiors of Maharashtra, Goa, Karnataka and wishes to spread its presence on many other national and international fronts.

MAST started working over 2 decades ago with a vision to eradicate visual impairment through identification, prevention, and treatment of partial or complete vision loss in communities around Mumbai suburbs and rural areas. They do this through screening camps in schools as well as communities. Once the problem is identified, patients are guided to Weekend camps held in the vicinity. Special drives to detect new cases. Patients are given treatment, counselling and miscellaneous services free of cost in special clinics where besides treatment services like early detection facility for establishing diagnosis are also provided.

In these camps, various types of vision deformities are corrected and protected with aids and appliances.

We've created special sponsorship programmer to assist the education of the children from rural background.

- To provide medical assistance, educational facilities including infrastructure, improve general health and wealth by reaching out to remotest parts of different states.

MISSION

To make every infant free of any possible occurring vision impairment or vision loss in future through early detection.

To eradicate cataract impairment

To provide free primary education aid in rural regions

To provide infrastructure for basic sanitation in assistance to education facilities to children

To identify and improve public health issues including sanitation

PAST ACTIVITIES

- Distributed required essentials and medical facilities to the village of Kozhencherry town in Pathanamthitta district of Central Travancore region in Kerala state on 25th August 2018 to 3rd September 2018.
- Since last 16years regularly conducted more than 1500 medical and eye-check-up camps. Approximately more then 7,00,000 peoples have been served in these camps.
- MAST had provided 10 Tons material of essential goods and even distributed medicine to the Kerala Flood Relief Victims.
- MAST had even provided medical aid for the treatment of Infant babies belongs to the under privileged family.

PRESENT ACTIVITIES

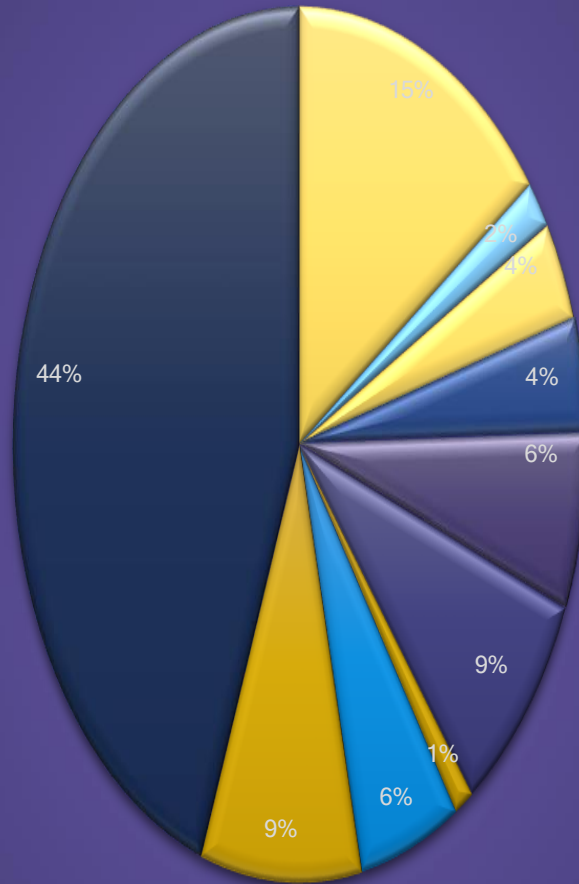
On 15th August, 2020 to 22nd August, 2020 served 3,50,000 people who were rendered homeless in the district of Kolhapur with the help of 1000 donors, team of 20 doctors from Fortis hospital, with Lions club of Bhandup Zeviarties and along with 30 volunteers, distributed 20 tons of essentials and lifesaving medicines worth Rs. 50 lakhs approx. as well as conducted medical and health check-up camps for flood victims.

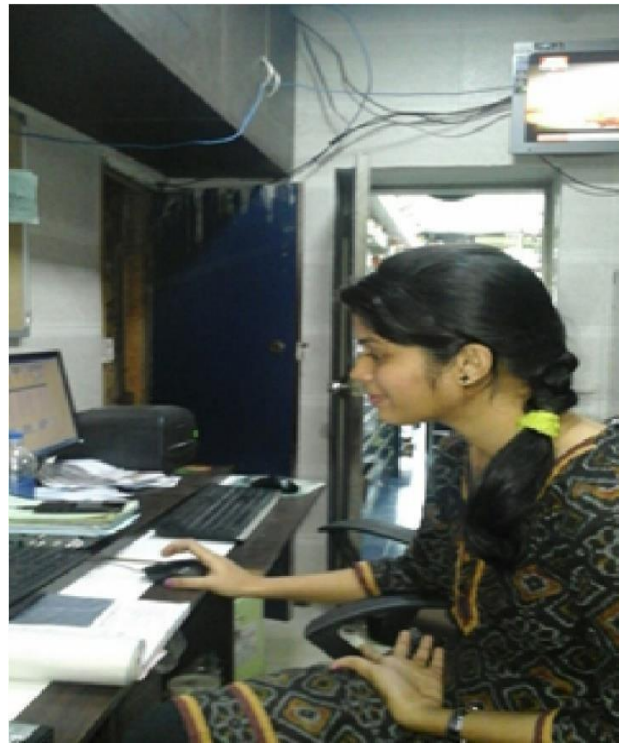

- Conducted awareness sessions for Anganwadi Sevika's on ear care on 21st Feb, 2021 and gave them training as to how to identify hearing problems.

- Conducted BERA test at Hiranandani Hospital, Powai on 25th June, 2020.
- In the month of September October and December we conducted ENT camps for schools of Ramji Shinde Ashram school, Mahatma Jyotibai Phule school and Rajashree Shahu Maharaj school respectively.
- Operated centres of skills development programme for unemployed and unskilled youth of Wagholi- Pune below the poverty line in order to build confidence and get suitable jobs.

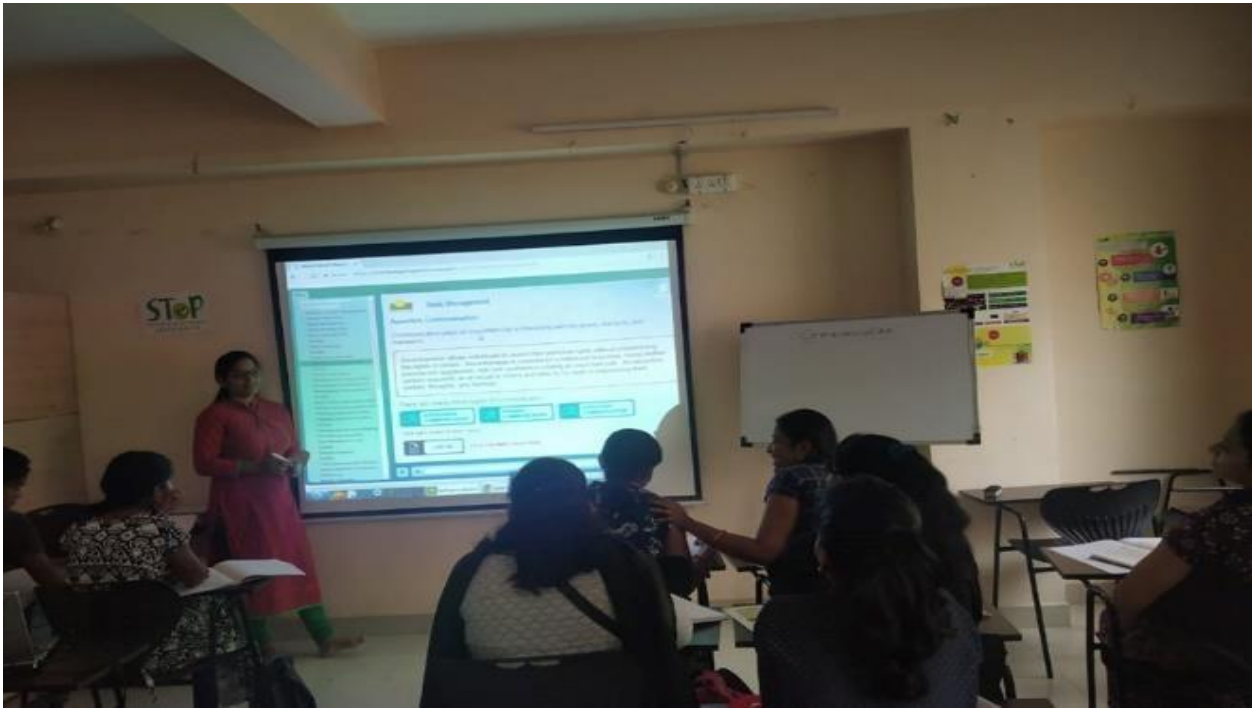
